Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Assalamu Alaikum wa Rahmatullahi wa Barakatuh

As I began to write this message, I realized another year has passed in the blink of an eye; however it has been a fruitful and challenging year for me as the chairman of Hong Kong Islamic Youth Association, and the entire team that drives HKIYA. With the endless dedication and diligence of the Executive Council, Sub-committees and staff members, we made solid progress on many fronts, including Education Bureau (EDB) grant for school-based support, the Muslim Youth Training Camp 2015, Peer Counsellor Training Programmes for Ethnic Minority Women, and Muslim Girls Swimming Course.

The school-based support fund has enabled us to expand our support to secondary school students. The association is providing after school English and Math tutorial classes from secondary one to secondary three students. We are also conducting Martial Arts and Dance Class for girls; Bakery Class, Art & Design Class and Football training is offered to all secondary school students. Next, the Muslim Youth Training Camp was held with the aim to promote 'Love & Tolerance' amongst Muslim youth. The camp was sponsored by the World Assembly of Muslim Youth. Furthermore, the Peer Counsellor Training Programme for EM Women is the first step towards a tailor-made counseling service for Muslims and non-Chinese. Last but not the least; the Muslim Girls Swimming Course has been organized in co-operation with the Jockey Club Scholars Alumni Association (JCSAA). A female instructor and Islamic swimming suit were arranged.

Throughout the year, HKIYA has worked closely with other organizations, NGOs and individual volunteers. Their cooperation and contributions towards the association's functions have resulted in the successful completion of our programmes. On behalf of HKIYA, I would like to express my greatest gratitude to all the organizations and individuals, with special thanks to Chinese Muslims Cultural & Fraternal Association, Islamic Union of HK, The Incorporated Trustees of the Islamic Community Fund of HK, Hong Kong Muslim Women Association, Islamic Kasim Tuet Memorial College, WAMY, RISEAP, RainLily, Jockey Club Scholars Alumni Association, Haji Noohu Yeung L. Commencement of Meeting

There being sufficient members to form a quorum, the Chairperson declared the opening of the 42nd Annual General Meeting of the Hong Kong Islamic Youth Association at 14:45 hours and invited Haji Saadullah SAT Sing-hin to recite Al-Fatihah.

Proceedings

To confirm the minutes of the 41st HKIYA Annual General Meeting held on 28th December 2013.

Amendments:-

1. To amend the spelling of "Haji Saadullah SAT Shing-hin" to "Haji Saadullah SAT Sing-hin" on the 3rd line of the voting member present list.
2. To amend the spelling of "Haji Saadullah SAT Shing-hin" to "Haji Saadullah SAT Sing-hin" on the 1st line of paragraph 02 HKIYA Annual Report 2012/2013.

There being no further amendment to the minutes of the 41st Annual General Meeting held on 28th December 2013, Sr. HIRA Khan proposed the minutes be confirmed. Her proposal was seconded by Br. Sheik Adam ISMAIL. There was no objection to the proposal and the minutes were confirmed.

To receive and adopt the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the Year of 2013/2014.

Annual Report 2013/2014

The chairperson briefed the meeting on the contents of the Annual Report 2013/2014.

Haji Yusuf YU said that the Association has only a small handful of voting members at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) and suggested to the committee to explore means to recruit more members into the Association and in attending general meetings. He said that the committee could recruit young Muslim at schools, encourage them to work in the Association's different sub-committees and to adopt the mentorship scheme in order to groom the young Muslim to be our future leaders.

He also added that there was wide time gap between the AGM and the Annual Dinner and this would discourage members in attending both functions on the same day.

The Chairperson replied that the committee had never stop recruiting young members into the Association with activities and recruitment drive at schools. She added that she would suggest to the new committee in considering methods of upgrading ordinary members to voting members in order to boost the number of voting member at the AGM.

She further said that in order to encourage members to attend both the AGM and Annual Dinner, she would recommend to the coming committee to consider the time gap of the two functions for next year's AGM and Annual Dinner.

There being no further comment from members, Br. Jaffar MOOSA proposed to adopt the Annual Report 2013/2014. His proposal was seconded by Haji Yusuf YU. There being no objection, the proposal was adopted.

Statement of Accounts for the Year of 2013/2014

Haji Saadullah SAT Sing-hin proposed to adopt the statement of accounts for the year 2013/2014. His proposal was seconded by Br. Adam Sheik ISMAIL. There being no objection, the proposal was adopted.

To elect General Council Members and Chairman in accordance with Articles 36 & 37 (c) of the Memorandum & Articles of the Association.

The Chairperson said that the 3rd item on the agenda was to elect General Council Members under Article 36 of the Memorandum & Articles of Association.

There was a total of 5 vacancies in the General Council, including places vacated as the results of the resignations of Sr. Fatimah Ong, Haji Saadullah SAT.

General Affairs

General Council

HKIYA Office and Office Coordinator

2. HKIYA was glad to have Sr. Fatimah Ong continues to act as the Office Coordinator. She contributed to the daily administration work as well as the activities organized during this year. She received a minimal allowance from the Association. HKIYA would like to sincerely thank her for her selfless sacrifices, time and efforts in contributing to the success of all events and activities in this year.

Library and Islamic Souvenirs

3. Islamic literature, DVDs and CDs in our library are available for lending at our office during opening hours. Some other books are being distributed free and are available at our 8/F office. We have also ordered beautiful scarves and prayer caps which are all available at our office at attractive prices.

Finance

4. For the financial year 2014-2015, the total revenue amounted to HK\$572,945 while the total expenditure was HK\$356,564. A surplus for the financial year of HK\$216,381 was recorded (comprising of HK\$135,129 from General fund and HK\$81,252 from Designated funds). Please refer to the independent auditors' report to the members for details on pages 19 to 31 in this report.

Donation by Ng Teng Fong Charitable Foundation Limited

5. In January 2015, HKIYA received a donation of HK\$100,000 from Ng Teng Fong Charitable Foundation Limited for supporting our charity work.

Zakat

6. The total Zakat collected during the year was HK\$168,180. Also, the General Council has approved to transfer HK\$25,000 to the Zakat's bank account in HSBC in order to meet the minimum bank balance (Note: this sum will not be treated as part of the Zakat). Together with the balance brought forward from last year of HK\$92,670, we have distributed the Zakat during the year as follows:

Membership

7. 42 brothers and sisters joined the Association in 2015. Currently, we have 77 voting and 195 ordinary members adding up to a total of 272 members.

HKIYA Homepage (www.hkiya.org.hk) and Facebook (HKIYA1973)

8. HKIYA has continuously updated the website with events and activities over the year. Furthermore, to meet the demand of the members and the community, we will soon have an enhanced and a new, fresh and up-to-date website with new features.

HKIYA has been successfully maintaining a Facebook page as an alternative platform to stay in touch and update the society with its events and activities. Regular posts relating to etiquette and religion, and motivational quotes have been

uploaded.

Youth Development Fund

9. HKIYA set up a "Youth Development Fund (Student)" ("YDF"), which was implemented in December, 2011. The target group for this YDF is full-time students not over the age of 22 and in need of financial subsidy to join our events and activities. We aim to encourage or assist youth in need so that they can join our events and activities without financial restriction. HKIYA has continuously made use of this fund to aid students in need over the year 2015.

Individual Major Projects

Cultural and Educational Activities

Public talk by Dr. Anis Ahmad

10. During the summer, Dr. Anis Ahmad was invited as one of the main speakers at the Muslim Youth Training Camp 2015 and making the best use of his presence, a public talk was organized on 24 July 2015 after Maghrib in Kowloon Masjid. The public talk was on the topic "Islam and Comprehensive Peace", which was appreciated by the audience. Dr. Anis Ahmad was requested to frequent his visits to Hong Kong so that the Hong Kong Muslim community can benefit from his rich experiences and knowledge at large.

Community-based Project (After-School Learning and Support Programmes)

11. The Education Bureau has sponsored Hong Kong Islamic Youth Association to conduct after school tutorial classes for junior secondary school students. Under the programme, HKIYA has hired 6 tutors to conduct English and Mathematics tutorial classes for junior secondary students in Islamic Kasim Tuet Memorial College.

Furthermore, the programme includes organizing and conducting interest classes. Therefore, HKIYA is providing various interest classes, such as Martial Arts, Dance Classes for girls, Bakery Classes, Art and Design Classes and Football training on a regular base for students of Islamic Kasim Tuet Memorial College.

Visit to Haji Omar Ramju Sadick Care and Attention Home

12. As a practice every year HKIYA organizes a visit to Haji Omar Ramju Sadick Care & Attention Home in Tuen Mun to spend time with the elderly. This year, our volunteers had a good time chatting, playing games and singing together with the elderly. Gifts were also distributed to the elderly and everyone had a good experience.

Interview with Students – CUHK interview 4 & 10 March 2015

13. Over the year, numerous students have contacted HKIYA to carry out interviews regarding Islam, its history, and the daily life of Muslims in Hong Kong. Some of HKIYA councils and volunteers were interviewed by students from the Department of Journalism and Communication of The Chinese University of Hong Kong on 4 & 10 March. The council introduced the basic concept of Islam and answered questions about the population and history of Muslims in Hong Kong, after that, we shared our personal stories, the daily life of Muslims and discussed some current society issues. The interview also included a tour of the Wanchai Islamic Centre. Afterwards, we were invited to their university for their final presentation about the Global Communication & culture in CUHK on 16 April 2015.

Interview with Students – CUHK interview 14 March 2015

14. HKIYA council and volunteers had an interview with two students on 14 March 2015, who are studying in the 1st year of Religious Studies under the Department of Cultural Religious Studies in CUHK. We introduced our association to them then answered some question regarding the Islamic commerce, the loan in Islam, then we brought them visit the prayer hall and show them what is congregation prayer, we also invited IKTMC Vice principal Br. Abu Bakar Ma

Interview with the journalist of South China Morning Post

15. HKIYA had an interview with journalist from the South China Morning Post on 24 Jan. 2015. Br. Zaiq Ali and Br. Moosa Jeffery answered the questions raised by the journalist regarding how the Muslim community has changed in the previous 175 years and how to get young people engaged in Islam; they also shared personal experiences. The article titled "Peace be with you: 175 years of Islam in Hong Kong" was posted in the Post Magazine of South China Morning Post on 15 February 2015.

Interview with student of HKBU

16. We had an interview with the student of HKBU for their publication on 26 August 2015, We introduced Islam to her and share our experiences about the daily life of Muslims in Hong Kong, and then we explained to her what is Jihad in Islam and removed her misconception from the negative news of Islam. We have invited a student who is studying in Islamic college to share his experience regarding studying and living in Hong Kong.

Interview with Prof. Wong of CUHK

17. HKIYA was invited to share its views, experiences and assisted the Department of

Cultural & Religious Studies of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, in its research "A study of Hong Kong Muslim Women in Hong Kong". The study aimed at examining and understanding of women's roles as Chinese Muslims, the interpretations of religious traditions, Chinese culture and family values and the construction of self-identities. The department was presented the annual reports of HKIYA from 1973 to 2014 for their reference.

Tutorial Classes for Secondary School Students

18. HKIYA hired tutors during the summer to support students preparing for the new academic year to equip them to successfully face new academic challenges and reach new heights.

Outreaching to Chinese University of HK

19. On 26 March 2015, HKIYA was invited to give a short talk on basic understanding of Islam to students in Chinese University of Hong Kong. Sisters also shared their experience about religion. All students seemed interested in our talk and sharing, some of them even tried to wear the Hijab and take photos with us. Alhamdulillah! This was a very meaningful outreaching event.

We did similar outreaching on 29 September 2015; we provided some books on Islam for the students and presented an introduction of the Muslim Community and basic Islamic concepts. We also screened two short Cantonese videos produced by HKIYA about 'Eid al-Fitr & Ramadan' and 'Hajj & Eid al-Adha', followed by a question and answer session with the students and lecturer of department of social work.

Happy Valley Cemetery Dawah

20. The Happy Valley Cemetery Dawah was conducted on the Chung Yeung Festival Day being the 21st of October, 2015. In order to uplift the awareness of Islam to our brothers and sisters visiting the cemetery, an Islamic educational outreach was made from 9:15 am to 4:30 pm. Books were distributed for free and at times, thoughtful discussions were made. We also invited the cemetery attendees to join our organization's events. All in all, the event was fruitful and we hope that this programme has at least to a small extent, raised the attendees' sense of identity as Muslims.

Public lecture cum Masjid Tour

21. Around 22 people, consisting of Muslims and non-Muslims, attended this event which was conducted in Ramadan specifically on the 4th of July, 2015 (Saturday) from 5:45 pm to 8:15 pm. This programme included a short talk on Islam followed by a Q&A section, after which thanks to the Islamic Union of Hong Kong's donation; we broke our fast with the attendees, prayed Maghrib prayer in front of

some of our non-Muslim participants who were amazed by it. After that, all of us had an enjoyable supper while simultaneously discussing Islam. Alhamdulillah, one Chinese sister embraced Islam during the supper section. May Allah SWT reward all those who contributed to this beneficial cause. Ameen.

Global Messenger Day

22. A Global Messenger Day was initiated on the 16th of May, 2015 in which different Islamic organizations worldwide aimed to uplift the awareness of our Prophet Muhammad (peace & blessings of Allah be upon him, his family and companions) to the masses. HKIYA is pleased to announce that we had 15 volunteers for this cause at Paterson Street in Causeway Bay from 10am until 5pm. Books were distributed for free and at times, discussions were made. May Allah SWT reward all those who contributed to this beneficial cause. Ameen.

Street Dawah Day

23. Despite the rainy weather, HKIYA was determined to do Dawah on the 30th of August, 2015 (Sunday) from 10:00 am to 4:45 pm at Charter Road, Central (opposite to Mandarin Oriental Hotel). Almost 30 participants volunteered to do Dawah. The volunteers braved the rain and held umbrellas while discussing Islam with interested people. By the grace and mercy of Allah S.W.T., one Filipino sister embraced Islam. Before the street Dawah programme, a Street Dawah Training workshop was held on the 29th of August, 2015 (Saturday) from 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm at 4/F (Classroom), Wan Chai Masjid. 7 people attended and learned some tips when it comes to giving Dawah. In sha Allah, it is planned that there will be a Christmas Street Dawah on the 25th of December, 2015 on who really Jesus is.

Welfare Activities

HKIYA 41st Anniversary Celebration and Annual Dinner

24. On 27 Dec 2014, HKIYA organized its Annual Dinner at the Indian Recreation Club. Fabulous prizes were won by participants. Over 100 persons participated in this event.

Zakat to Poor Muslims in Rohingya

25. HKIYA has distributed Zakat in Rohingya to provide the people with basic needs such as food, water and other essentials.

Blood donation Day

26. A blood donation event was organized on 26th Sep, 2015 at Causeway Bay Blood Donation Center since the availability of blood is of utmost concern during emergencies. In sha Allah, there will be more similar events in the future.

Charity Sales

27. HKIYA organized a Charity Sale at G/F, Masjid Ammar in early November this year. Most of the goods were donated by kind Muslims, including home appliances, clothing, toys and stationeries. The best-selling goods were scarves and hijabs. HKIYA rose over \$20,000 in the Charity Sale.

Public Relation

Peer Counsellor Training Programme for Ethnic Minority Women

28. The training programme was co-organized with Rainlily to train Ethnic Minority ladies to be equipped with basic counseling skills to counsel fellow EM females when required and to prevent domestic violence and abuse. A total of eight sessions were held on various topics such as 'self-protection', 'understanding victims' rights and the law and Islamic teachings in protecting woman', and 'basic counseling skills (reflective and empathic) etc.

Artwork Display at Community Art Gallery in MTR station

29. HKIYA displayed Islamic artwork of our members at Tin Hau MTR station. The artwork was displayed for the whole month of November 2015.

Iftar & Dinner gathering

30. The Consulate General of America hosted an Iftar dinner at the residence of Consul General as a good gesture towards the Muslim community. This Ramadan year 1436 (2015), HKIYA was among the selected organizations invited for the Iftar dinner. After the Iftar dinner, our chairman submitted a letter of concern and Islamic literature to the Consul General Jr. Clifford A. Hart; and as appreciation Consul General Jr. Clifford A. Hart presented our chairman with a souvenir.

Muslim booklets to Carnival Function in Siu Sai Wan

31. HKIYA donated around 50 'Hong Kong Muslims' booklets to an organization's carnival function in Siu Sai Wan.

Donation to HKU Muslim Students' Association

32. HKIYA donated 30 Chinese translated and 2 Arabic Qurans to Muslim Students' Association, H.K.U.S.U of the University of Hong Kong. HKIYA also contributed \$5000 towards the HKU-MSA as annual program support.

Volunteering Team Recruitment of Volunteers

Recreational Activities

Muslim girls swimming class

34. To promote healthy lifestyle amongst Muslim girls, for the first time, swimming classes were organized in cooperation with Jockey Club's Scholars Alumni Association. A female coach was arranged to teach the girls basic swimming skills in an appropriate environment. The community has shown interest in the swimming course, therefore, more swimming courses will be organized for Muslim girls in near future. The swimming course will be further improved, as we learn from experiences.

35. A BBQ event was held on 22nd March, 2015 at the Tai Au Mun Clearwater Bay Country Park. More than 60 participants with their friends and families joined and enjoyed the whole day. People flew kites and hike in an amazing cool weather. It was a perfect day.

BBQ for Girls at IKTMC

36. A BBQ gathering was arranged on 16th October, 2015 for the female students of Islamic Kasim Tuet Memorial College at their school so that they could enjoy a carefree afternoon.

BBQ for Boys at Mui Wo Beach

37. A BBQ event for boys from Islamic Kasim Tuet Memorial College was held at the Mui Wo Beach in Lantau on 21st October, 2015. Students had a sand creation competition with which they could form anything they liked. In all, it was a very satisfying day with the youth preparing food and materials for themselves.

Muslim Youth Training Camp 2015

38. The Muslim Youth Training Camp themed "Love & Tolerance" was held on the Salvation Army Bradbury Camp, Cheung Chau, from 24 to 26 July, 2015. The camp was sponsored by the World Assembly of Muslim Youth (WAMY). The goal of the camp was to provide a platform for Muslim youths from different parts of Asia to learn and share their knowledge and experiences in Islam. Two speakers, Professor Anis Ahmad (Vice-chancellor and Meritorious Professor of Islamic and

Comparative Religion, Riphah International University, Islamabad, Pakistan) and Doctor Ibrahim Chao (Former Taiwan Representative in Saudi Arabia) were invited to give lectures and workshops for our participants. The camp program also included BBQ, amazing race, hiking and sightseeing on Cheung Chau Island. About 100 brothers and sisters from Hong Kong, Taiwan, Shenzhen and Guangzhou attended the camp. 40. The bowling activity was organized on 7th April, 2015 at the Disciplined Services Sports and Recreation Club, particularly for female students from Islamic Kasim Tuet Memorial College and their Mentors. Participants competed with each other and exchanged their bowling skills. Everyone enjoyed and had a afternoon full of fun.

Publication

Strive

41. Strive has continued to provide information and activities about HKIYA to members and the Muslim community in the year 2015. This year, the content has increased to eight-pages. A number of articles suitable for adolescents were published, such as "6 fabulous tips to fast track your career", "how to show empathy", etc. In the year 2015, a total of three issues were published; each issue includes articles submitted from our readers, allowing them to share their life experiences and their point of view of the religion. Moreover, the "Smoothing the pathway" section enhanced our readers' spiritual awareness.

Short Islamic Videos

42. HKIYA has produced two short videos on "Ramadan & Eid al-Fitr" and "Hajj & Eid al-Adha" in Cantonese with Chinese subtitles. **ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND EXPLANATORY NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2015**

1 GENERAL INFORMATION

The Association, being a company limited by guarantee, was domiciled and incorporated in Hong Kong under the Companies Ordinance on 26 May 1999. Under the provisions of its memorandum and articles of association, every member shall, in the event of the Association being wound up, contribute to the assets of the Association to the extent of HK\$1. As at 31 August 2015, the Association had 272 registered members.

The Association is principally engaged in the promotion of Islamic principles and the encouragement of its members to study and practise Islam. The address of its registered office is &F., O.R. Sadick Islamic Centre, No. 40 Oi Kwan Road, Wanchai, Hong Kong.

These financial statements are presented in the functional currency, viz. Hong Kong dollars.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION AND ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Association qualifies for the reporting exemption as a small guarantee company under section 359(1) of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance (Cap. 622) and is therefore entitled to prepare and present its financial statements in accordance with the Small and Medium-sized Entity Financial Reporting Standard (SME-FRS) issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (HKICPA).

As the first year of adoption, these financial statements comply with the SME-FRS and have been prepared under the accrual basis of accounting and on the basis that the Association is a going concern. The measurement base adopted is the historical cost convention.

Prior to 1 September 2014, the Association prepared its financial statements in accordance with the Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standard for Private Entities (HKFRS for Private Entities) issued by HKICPA and the requirements of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance (Cap. 32). They were prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of financial assets and financial liabilities which were carried at fair value. A reconciliation of net assets at the transition date, 31 August 2014, stated under these two standards is shown in Note 19.

The following are specific accounting policies that are necessary for a proper understanding of the financial statements:

(a) Revenue recognition

Provided that it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the revenue transaction will flow to the Association and the revenue and costs, if any, in respect of the transaction can be measured reliably, revenue is recognised as follows:

- (i) Subscriptions and donations are recognised as revenue when the subscriptions or donations are received.
- (ii) Interest income is recognised on a time proportion basis taking into account the principal outstanding and the interest rate applicable.

**ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND EXPLANATORY NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2015 - continued**

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION AND ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

(b) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Subsequent expenditure is charged to the asset's carrying amount only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance costs are expensed in the income statement during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Depreciation of property, plant and equipment is calculated using the straight line method to allocate cost to their residual values over their estimated useful lives. The annual rate of depreciation for furniture, fixtures and equipment is 20%.

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

(c) Investments in securities

Current investments are stated at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Long-term investments are stated at cost less accumulated impairment losses.

(d) Designated funds

All income accruing to and all expenses attributable to designated funds are accounted for directly in each particular fund.

The General Council have the discretion to use or transfer any funds in the furtherance of the objects of the Association except in instances where funds and donations when received for a specific purpose shall not be utilized for any other purpose without the prior approval of the donors.

(e) Foreign currency translation

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the exchange rate prevailing at the dates of the transactions. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translation at year-end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognised in the income statement.

(f) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

42. 香港伊斯蘭青年協會於本年以粵語製作了兩個簡短視頻“齋月和開齋節”和“卓牲節”并配有中文字幕。

該視頻觀看人次已達 70,000 人。影片可以在 Facebook 網頁查看（用 HKIYA1973 們）。

這觀看人次表示有更多此類視頻的需求。我們會繼續努力製作有意義的影片，月傳播伊斯蘭善良的風俗及向社會介紹我們的信仰，以化解大眾對伊斯蘭之 Insha'Allah。我們感謝 WAMY 贊助部分視頻製作。

大嶼山一天遊

37. 今年 10 月 21 日，伊青在大嶼山梅窩海灘為伊斯蘭脫維善紀念中學的男同學舉辦了燒烤活動。當日還舉辦了一個沙灘創作大賽，深受同學們歡迎。整體來說，這是一個非常令人滿意的一天。

愛與寬容夏令營 2015

38. 由香港伊斯蘭青年協會主辦及 World Assembly of Muslim Youth 贊助的“愛與寬容”穆斯林青年訓練營成功於 2015 年 7 月 24-26 期間在長洲救世軍白普理營舉行。是次訓練營的目的是為來自不同地區的青年穆斯林提供一個平台去學習和分享伊斯蘭教的知識和經驗。我們更有幸邀請到兩位學者參與這一次訓練營，包括來自巴基斯坦的 Professor Anis Ahmad 以及來自台灣的趙錫麟博士，兩位皆是對伊斯蘭教有深入認識的學者，他們在講座和工作坊上分享了很多伊斯蘭教的知識。訓練營的節目還包括燒烤晚會，野外定向，行山以及參觀長洲各旅遊景點。訓練營的 100 餘位青年均來自香港、台灣、廣州以及深圳。

每月遠足活動

39. 過去一年，近乎每個月也有安排遠足活動。活動由六個本港伊斯蘭組織合辦（排名不分先後：伊斯蘭文化協會，香港中國回教協會，香港伊斯蘭聯會，中華回教博愛社，香港回教婦女協會和本會）。遠足場地包括石崗，大埔沙螺洞和香港仔。各參加者都非常喜歡到不同景點遠足和野餐。

女生保齡球活動

40. 女生保齡球活動在 4 月 7 日特別為伊斯蘭脫維善紀念中學的女同學和導師舉行，地點為紀律部隊人員體育及康樂會。當日參與者互相競爭，並互相交換玩保齡球的技巧和心得，大家都過了一個有趣的下午。

出版

力行通訊

41. 伊青由創會至今一直都致力推廣伊斯蘭教義和文化。伊青出版了一本叫力行的會員刊物，一年出版四期，內容整作用心，除了報道本會舉辦的各項活動，還邀請了有興趣寫作的穆斯林讀者投稿。力行以中文和英文兩種語言為主，當中常引用古蘭經章節，並加插精美相片，務求讓會員和讀者增進宗教知識。

捐贈給香港大學的穆斯林學生會

32. 本會今年捐贈了 30 本中文翻譯和 2 本阿拉伯文<古蘭經>給香港大學的穆斯林學生會。
伊青亦捐贈了港幣 5000 元為支持穆斯林學生會之活動及行政費用。

義工招募

33. 為了令青年人對香港有歸屬感及發展他們的潛能，香港伊斯蘭青年協會組成 ” 義工與發展小組 ”。透過活動，我們鼓勵參與者為社會作出貢獻，重塑 ” 我們不是服務和資源受助 ” 的形象，而是無論何時何地能為香港的繁榮作出貢獻。

康樂活動

穆斯林姊妹游泳班

公共關係

少數族裔婦女輔導員培訓計劃

28. 該培訓計劃是本會與”風雨蘭”合辦，為少數族裔婦女們具備基本的諮詢技巧，在需要的時候能為少數族裔之女性能處理和面對 “家庭暴力”和”虐待”安排。培訓計劃共有八節:專題如 “自我保護”， “理解受害者的權利和法律保障” 及有關伊斯蘭如何保障婦女”和 “基本輔導技巧如反射和移情等。

地鐵站藝術展板陳列

29. 本會於 11 月在天后地鐵站之藝術展板展示了我們年輕會員的伊斯蘭畫作。

齋月及開齋眾餐

30. 美國駐香港總領事夏千福於今年齋月 1436（2015 年）在領事官邸舉辦了開齋晚宴，以作為對穆斯林社區表達良好的關係。香港伊斯蘭青年協會為被邀請的機構之一。在晚餐後，主席 Zaiq Ali 提交了希望美國能關注穆斯林之信件和有關伊斯蘭之書籍作為感謝總領事夏千福之邀請。

小西灣嘉年華

31. 伊青捐贈了大約 50 本 “香港穆斯林的小冊子” 予小西灣一個嘉年華的攤位。

伊斯蘭宣教日

撰辭之際，本人察體會到光陰似箭，自己快將完成本屆香港伊斯蘭青年協會主席任期。過去一年獲益良多，雖然充滿挑戰，但在幹事委員會成員、顧問、職員無私地奉獻心力並熱心服務下，我們取得多項實質成果，包括成功申領校本支援計劃津貼、舉辦伊斯蘭夏令營 2015、完成少數族裔婦女朋輩輔導訓練計劃及伊斯蘭女青年泳術課程。

第一，我們善用校本支援計劃津貼去加強支援中學生，為中一至中三學生提供英文及數學科的補習班，以及為各級學生舉辦武術、女子舞蹈、烘焙、美術與設計，以及足球培訓課程。第二，我們透過穆斯林夏令營向穆斯林青年及兒童推廣「愛與寬容」的信息，獲世界穆斯林青年會贊助。第三，少數族裔婦女朋輩輔導訓練計劃成為了首個為非華裔人士及穆斯林度身訂造的輔導項目。最後，伊斯蘭女青年泳術課程聘請了女教練，給我們合適條件以玉成其事。
