First of all, may I take the opportunity to extend my deepest gratitude to the 40th Executive Committee for their dedication and hard work in organizing various activities and projects. We also appreciate all the support and patronage by all organizations, and brothers and sisters; and in particular, those who have supported us financially. We have faced a lot of challenges and difficulties this year. With the guidance & blessings from Allah (swt) and remembering the teaching from the Quran, we overcame these hurdles with patience and rewarded us as a cohesive team.

This year we focus on the source of fundings and building relationship with other organizations and exploring financial resources. This provides a valuable opportunity in allowing us to promote the beauty of Islam.

General Affairs

General Council

1. At the start of the year, there were five vacant posts after the Annual General Meeting from the resignation of Br. Mohamad Zaiq ALI, Br. Azir KHAN, Sr. Hanifah YU Kwong-yan and Sr. Nafisah YU Kwong-ying, and a previously vacant post.

There were some changes in the Council throughout the year 2013. Two members, Sr. Nafees Begum BAIG and Br. Adam LI resigned from their posts on 24th March, 2013. Br. Mohamad Zaiq ALI, Sr. Sydekka YUEN and Sr. TUET King Ping Sharifa joined the council in April 2013, as Culture & Educational Officer, Welfare Officer and Quarter Master respectively. Br. RAZI Raza Nasir joined the Council as Public Relations Officer in September 2013. The current 40th General Council office bearers are as follow:

HKIYA Office and Office Helpers

2. HKIYA was glad to have sister Sr. Sydekka YUEN and Sr. Aliiyah M as Office Helpers this year from January to February and from November to December respectively. They both contributed to the daily office work as well as the activities organized during this year. They both received a very minimal transportation allowance from the Association. HKIYA sincerely thanks them both for their selfless sacrifices, time and efforts in contributing to the success of all events and activities in this year.

Library and Islamic Souvenirs

3. Islamic literatures, DVDs and CDs in our library are available for lending at our office during opening hours. However, some of the books are being distributed freely and are available at our 8/F office. We have also ordered beautiful scarves, prayer mats, and prayer caps which are all available at our office at attractive prices.

Finance

4. For the financial year 2012-2013, the total revenue amounted to HK\$ 386,146 while the total expenditure was HK\$199,229 (including a fair value gain on available-for-sale financial assets of HK\$10,184). A surplus for the financial year of HK\$186,917 was recorded (comprising of HK\$161,814 from General fund and HK\$25,103 from Designated funds). Please refer to the independent auditors' report to the members for details on pages **16 to 27** in this report.

Zakat

5. The total Zakat collected during the year was HK\$125,197.12. Together with a balance brought forward from last year of HK\$95,561.84, we have distributed the Zakat during the year as follows:

6. In July, HKIYA received a donation of HK\$100,000 from Ng Teng Fong Charitable Foundation Limited for supporting our charity work.

Membership

7. 25 brothers and sisters joined the Association in 2013. Currently, we have 74 voting and 156 ordinary members adding up to a total of 230 members.

8. Our Association has enhanced our website during the year. We have added some new features, including modifying the first page and adding links that lead to different episodes of our Youtube Online Video Channel. For more details, please visit www.hkiya.org.hk.

Youth Development Fund

9. HKIYA set up a "Youth Development Fund (Student)" ("YDF"), implemented in December 2011. The target group for this YDF is full-time students not over the age of 22 and in need of financial subsidy to join our events and activities. We aim to encourage or assist the youth in need so that they can join our events and activities without financial restriction.

Individual Major Projects

Cultural and Educational Activities

Rice Dumpling Making Workshop

10. In order to exchange cultural understanding, HKIYA was invited by U magazine and Hong Kong Electric to participate at a Rice Dumpling workshop. 12 sisters were invited to join with the members at the HKE Home Management Centre in sharing their experience and learn to make

vegetarian dumplings. The event allow others to understand Muslim's dietary requirement. Students brought home their lovely rice dumpling after the workshop. The event was covered at U magazine on July 4, 2013 issue.

Summer Islamic Leadership Camp

11. The 2013 Summer Islamic leadership camp (I-camp) was successfully held from 9th to 11th August during the summer holidays. The I-camp was organized by the Hong Kong Islamic Youth Association and sponsored by World Assembly of Muslim Youth (WAMY) with the main aim of training our Islamic youth to become leaders. We were delighted to have Dr. Fatima Suo and Sr. Aida Wong from Malaysia as our guest speakers. There were 76 participants, including 8 Muslim participants from China. Activities included Islamic lectures by our guest speakers, BBQ night of the celebration of Eid-Al Fitr, early morning hiking, group competitions and leadership training sessions, ending with a delicious lunch and a talk at the Chinese Muslim Cultural and Fraternal Association (CMCFA). Everyone learnt a lot in the few short days and had a great time together.

Visit Haji Omar Ramju Sadick Care and Attention Home

12. Each year, HKIYA will gather volunteers to visit the elderly at Haji Omar Ramju Sadick Care and Attention Home in Tuen Mun. This year, we visited them on 24 February 2013. We chatted, played games, sang songs and distributed gifts to the elderly.

Interview from students

13. Due to the curriculums in local schools and colleges, there is a demand for students to seek for information on Islam. HKIYA has received enquiry through emails, calling and face-to-face interview with the students. During Ramadan, we have introduced Islam to several students and few of them attended our Iftar and Taraweed prayers which gave them a new perspective about Islam. At the same time, they have given second thoughts on their inner self and the meaning of life.

Welfare Activities

39th Annual Dinner

14. On 23 December 2012, HKIYA organized its Annual Dinner at the 6/F

Seminar Room, O.R. Sadick islamic Centre. We offered souveniers to volunteers who have helped in organising HKIYA activities during the year and also attractive prizes for participants of the Annual Dinner. More than 90 guests attended.

Sponsor for Iftar and Dinner

15. This year HKIYA sponsored Iftar to Pakistan, Sri Lanka, China, Philippines and Indonesia. Alhamdulillah! A greater number of needy brothers and sisters have benefited from the sponsorship.

Zakat to Poor Muslims in Gaza

16. Hong Kong Islamic Youth Association has distributed Zakat to the poor Muslims in Gaza to provide basic needs such as clean water and daily essentials for poor Muslims.

Zakat to Poor Muslims in Syria

17. HKIYA has distributed Zakat to the poor muslims in Syria to provide basic needs such as clean water and daily essentials for poor muslims.

Zakat to refugees in Syria

18. HKIYA has distributed Zakat to refugees in Syria in hopes of providing them with daily essentials such as shelter and food.

Charity Sales

19. HKIYA organised a two-day Charity Sale at 8/F, Masjid Ammar in early October this year. Most of the goods were donated by kind Muslims, including home appliances, clothing, toys and stationeries. The best-selling goods were scarves and hijabs. HKIYA raised around \$2,000 in the Charity Sale, which will be added to the Youth Development Fund to aid the development of needy youth. We thank all donors for contributing to this event.

Public Relation

Summer Camp fo Asian Chinese Muslim Youth 2013

20. The Chinese Muslim Association in Taiwan organized a 4-day Islamic knowledge camp for Mandarin speaking youth of Asian countries in late August. The camp was held from 20 to 23 August, 2013 in Taipei, Taiwan and HKIYA was invited to nominate two youth to join the camp. All travel expenses were covered by the Chinese Muslim Association. Camp program included lectures and discussions about various aspects of Islam. The participants were able to interact with Muslim youth from Hong Kong, Taiwan, Singapore and Malaysia. The camp was also accompanied by tours to local Mosques, the National Palace Museum and night markets.

<u>Eid-ul-Adha luncheon by the Muslim Student Association, University of Hong Kong</u>

21. HKIYA has sponsored the Eid ul Adha luncheon organized by the Muslim Student Association at the University of Hong Kong. Representatives have attended the event and the council of MSA appreciated the contribution of the Eid ul Adha luncheon. The luncheon was well received with over 120 guests including overseas students, professors and staff.

23. This year's Children Eid Party was held on 26th October, 2013. The party consisted of fun group games, an art workshop and a lot of food and presents. Children were taught to make a sheep using cotton after learning about the story of Eid-ul-Adha. Everyone had a great time in addition to increasing their Islamic knowledge.

Publication

Strive

24. HKIYA has always made use of their newsletter "Strive" to communicate with members every season. There have been 3 issues this year. To make Strive more interesting and attractive, we have changed the design and layout this year. By including more Quran verses and beautiful pictures of nature, we wish to let our readers feel the miracles of Allah through both words and pictures. The four newly divided sections of the newsletter are called "Sharing the Moment", "Smoothing the Pathway", "Seeing the Muslim World" and "Serving the Community". In the future, we hope more of our members will join us and share their articles in Strive.

YouTube HKIYA Online Video Channel (OVC)

25. In 2012, HKIYA launched the world's first Cantonese Islamic online channel – Online Video Channel (OVC), which is solely produced by our association OVC team. This continued on into early 2013 with over 70 episodes broadcasted at the Youtube channel: www.youtube.com/HKIYA1973. All is welcome to learn more about Islam through the OVC. In the future, we hope to provide more Da'wah opportunity through our Youtube channel.

HKIYA apps – Islam HK

26. Due to some technical problems and resignation of the responsible council, the apps was discontinued in May 2013. The council is now seeking for new vendors and creating a new apps with new content for the Andriod system, which will be launched in the near future.

We have audited the financial statements of Hong Kong Islamic Youth Association ("the Association") set out on pages 2 to 11, which comprise the balance sheet as at 31 August 2013, and the statement of income, statement of changes in funds and cash flow statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Directors' (general council members') responsibility for the financial statements

The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1 GENERAL INFORMATION

The Association, being a company limited by guarantee, was domiciled and incorporated in Hong Kong under the Companies Ordinance on 26 May 1999. Under the provisions of the Association's memorandum and articles of association, every member shall, in the event of the Association being wound up, contribute to the assets of the Association to the extent of HK\$1. As at 31 August 2013, the Association had 221 registered members.

The Association is principally engaged in the promotion of Islamic principles and the encouragement of its members to study and practise Islam. The address of its registered office is 8/F., O.R. Sadick Islamic Centre, No. 40 Oi Kwan Road, Wanchai, Hong Kong.

These financial statements are presented in the functional currency, viz. Hong Kong dollars,

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION AND ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standard for Private Entities (HKFRS for Private Entities) issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (HKICPA) and the requirements of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. They have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of financial assets which are carried at fair value.

(a) Revenue recognition

Provided that it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the revenue transaction will flow to the Association and the revenue and costs, if any, in respect of the transaction can be measured reliably, revenue is recognised as follows:

- Subscriptions and donations are recognised as revenue when the subscriptions or donations are received.
- (ii) Interest income is recognised on a time proportion basis taking into account the principal outstanding and the interest rate applicable.

(b) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Subsequent expenditure is charged to the asset's carrying amount only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance costs are expensed in the income statement during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Depreciation of property, plant and equipment is calculated using the straight line method to allocate cost to their residual values over their estimated useful lives. The annual rate of depreciation for furniture, fixtures and equipment is 20%.

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION AND ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

(c) Investments in available-for-sale financial assets

Available-for-sale financial assets are included in non-current assets unless management intends to dispose of the investment within 12 months of the balance sheet date. They are carried at fair value with changes in fair value recognised in the income statement. When securities classified as available-for-sale are sold or impaired, the accumulated fair value adjustments are included in the income statement as gain or losses from investment securities.

(d) Designated funds

All income accruing to and all expenses attributable to designated funds are accounted for directly in each particular fund.

The General Council have the discretion to use or transfer any funds in the furtherance of the objects of the Association except in instances where funds and donations when received for a specific purpose shall not be utilized for any other purpose without the prior approval of the donors.

(e) Foreign currency translation

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the exchange rate prevailing at the dates of the transactions. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translation at year-end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognised in the income statement.

(f) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.
