General Affairs

General Council

1. There was one empty post after the Annual General Meeting. Sr. Zainab Ho was later found not eligible as a member of General Council due to Article 32 of the Articles of Association. One voting member & one ordinary member were then elected to the General Council after the AGM according to Articles 9(c) and 35(b) of the Articles of Association and they were Sr. Sharifa Tuet Kin Ping and Br. HKIYA Office and Office Helpers

2. HKIYA was glad to have sister Fatima WONG as Office Helpers. She provided office support work to Association in the daily office duties as well as in the activities during the year. She received very minimal allowance from the Association and we sincerely thank her for her selfless sacrifices, time and efforts in contributing to the work of the Association.

Also, due to renovation work in our office at 8/F, the HKIYA office has been relocated temporarily to Rm 705, 7/F, Masjid Ammar & O.R.S. Islamic Centre effective from 1 August, 2011.

Library and Islamic Souvenirs

3. We have been continuing our limited library service for members. Islamic literatures, DVDs and CDs are available for lending at our office during opening hours. We have also ordered beautiful scarves, prayer mats, and prayer caps which are all available at our office at attractive prices.

Finance

4. The total receipts for the financial year 2010-2011 was HK\$156,168 (including a fair value gain on available-for-sale financial assets of HK\$2,239) and the total expenditure was HK\$180,996. A deficit for the year of HK\$24,828 was recorded (comprising of HK\$24,695 from General fund and HK\$133 from Designated funds). Please refer to the independent auditors' report to the members for details on pages 16 to 27 in this report.

Zakat

5. The total Zakat collected during the year was HK\$92,620*. Together with a balance brought forward from last year of HK\$77,492, we have distributed the Zakat during the year as follows:

*(*Highlight: including a total sum of \$5,190 original collected for victims in Indonesia's earthquake. However, HKIYA has tried hard but still could not find any reliable organisations to distribute this sum to those victims. Finally, the General Council passed a decision to treat this sum for use in future as general Zakat)*

Individual Major Projects

Cultural and Educational Activities

Understanding Islam Workshop

8. "Understanding Islam Workshop" was held on April 22-25th, 2011 by Serving Islam Team (HK) and HKIYA supported the event by contributing HK\$10,000. Br. Fadel Soliman - Director of Bridges Foundation - who is a specialized expert in training the Muslims on how they should represent their religion was invited to conduct the workshop. The aim of the workshop was to train the Muslims of Hong Kong on how to present Islam, conveys Islam and how to refute any misconception about Islam. Ten members from HKIYA attended the workshop.

Talks on Islam and Science Series 2011 – Return of Jesus

9. Mr. Turgut Aksu and Dr. Ahmet Oktar Babuna from Harun Yahya Foundation (Turkey) were invited to deliver a series of talks on Islam and Science on May 7 to May 10 in Hong Kong. HKIYA co-organized the talk titled 'Return of Jesus' with the Kowloon Masjid Dawah Committee that was organized on May 8 in Kowloon Masjid.

Ramadan Ibadah Camp 2011

10. The Camp was organized on 27th Night of Ramadan 1432 (26 August, 2011) in Masjid Ammar in collaboration with Islamic Kasim Tuet Memorial College. A

total of 50 brothers & sisters participated in the camp, including teachers and students from IKTMC. Talks were delivered by brothers on various daily lives related topics, in the light of Islam. The camp was further enriched by the performance of a visiting Nasheed singer from Australia, Bro. Hameed Attai. Students joined the congregational over-night prayer session. Sahoor was provided by Islamic Union of HK and the camp ended after the Fajar (morning) prayer. All the student participants were given ocean park tickets upon completion of the Ibadah Camp. Special thanks to IUHK for their support. May Allah Almighty reward them.

Welfare Activities

37th Annual Dinner

11. On 19th December 2010, HKIYA organized its Annual Dinner at the Canteen on 5th Floor, O.R. Sadick Islamic Centre. We offered souvenirs to volunteers who have helped in organizing HKIYA activities during the year and also attractive prizes for participants of the Annual Dinner. We would like to express our appreciation to Raffles Gifts for donating some special prizes on that day.

Visit Haji Omar Ramju Sadick Care and Attention Home

12. A visit to the care and attention home was organized on Sunday, 13th February 2011. The volunteers spent time talking with the elderly residents and gifts were distributed. We have tea with the elderly and played some games together. We would like to express our appreciation to brothers and sisters that made a donation in supporting this event.

Zakat to Pakistan Flood

13. Heavy rains, flash floods and landslides have devastated Pakistan again in this year. More than 1,100 people have already lost their lives and affected 2.5 Million people and over 400,000 have become homeless. Livestock, houses, bridges, link roads and communication infrastructure have been washed away by severe floods. Hong Kong Islamic Youth Association has liaised with an International Islamic Organisation to distribute Zakat for providing much needed medicines, clean water, tents and essential emergency items to assist those affected by the flood.

Zakat to poor muslims in masjid in Anhui

14. Hong Kong Islamic Youth Association has distributed Zakat through a masjid in Anhui to provide basic needs (like clean water and daily essentials) for poor Muslims.

Zakat to sponsor poor Dawah workers/religious teachers/Imams from Yunnan to go for a Islamic study tour to Thailand

15. Hong Kong Islamic Youth Association has distributed Zakat through Imam Sulaiman Wang to sponsor some Dawah workers, religious teachers and Imams from Yunnan to go for an Islamic Study tour to Thailand.

Zakat to poor muslims in masjids and muslims schools in Thailand

16. Hong Kong Islamic Youth Association has distributed Zakat through Imam Sulaiman Wang to help poor Muslims in masjids and schools in Chiang Mai, Thailand.

Zakat to victims of Drought Crisis in Horn of Africa

17. Since mid-July 2011, a severe drought has been affecting the entire East Africa region. The drought has caused a severe food crisis across Somalia, Ethiopia and Kenya. Many refugees are Muslims have fled to neighboring Kenya and Ethiopia, where crowded, unsanitary conditions together with severe malnutrition have led to a large number of deaths. Hong Kong Islamic Youth Association distributed the Zakat through Islamic Union of Hong Kong to the International Islamic Organisation to provide emergency support, including food, shelter, water and hygiene kits, and follow up with rehabilitation assistance to help the poorest victims rebuild and improve their lives.

Public Relation

Fast a Day with the Kids

18. Fast a Day with the Kids was organized at Madrasah-tul-Hira (Sham Shui Po) on the 6th August 2011(Saturday). Non-Muslim friends joined and experienced Fasting and open Fast with the kids. They were given basic information on Ramadhan by IKTMC student, Iqra Sultan, followed by games and souvenirs being distributed to the students of Madrasah-tul-Hira.

This visit was jointly organized with the Muslimah Group, Muslim Professional Network, The Women's Foundation, Islamic Kasim Tuet Memorial College, Hazrat Sultan Bahu Society and HK Islamic Youth Association.

62nd National Day Celebration Dinner

19. In order to celebrate the 62nd anniversary of the establishment of the People's Republic of China (PRC), HKIYA has jointly organized a celebration dinner with 4 other Islamic organizations on 24 September 2011. Over 150 guests attended the banquet. The Guest of Honor, Mr Liu Fei, from Liaison Office of the Central People's Government in the HKSAR attended and thanked the Islamic community in sharing the joy of the country's National Day. The evening also received a great support from guests including Consul General of Egypt, Indonesia, Iran, Brunei and Malaysia.

Eid Carnival at Islamic Kasim Tuet Memorial College

20. HKIYA took part in the Eid Carnival held at Islamic Kasim Tuet Memorial College in Chaiwan on 13 November 2011. This event was co-organized by the Islamic Kasim Tuet Memorial School and The Chinese Muslim Cultural & Fraternal Association. Performances, game stalls, food and drinks as arranged for all the participants and HKIYA had one food stall selling cookies arranged at the event.

Knowledge Quiz & Flea Market at Pakistan Club

21. HKIYA participated in the Knowledge Quiz and Flea Market organized by the Pakistan Association of Hong Kong at the Pakistan Club on 20 November 2011. There was a quiz on general knowledge in Islam and current world affairs to students. Our association had a free health check-up corner that day offering blood pressure and BMI (body mass index) measure.

We have audited the financial statements of Hong Kong Islamic Youth Association ("the association") set out on pages 2 to 11, which comprise the balance sheet as at 31 August 2011, and the statement of income, statement at changes in funds and cash flow statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Directors' (general council members') responsibility for the financial statements



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1 GENERAL INFORMATION

The Association, being a company limited by guarantee, was domiciled and incorporated in Hong Kong under the Companies Ordinance on 26 May 1999. Under the provisions of the Association's Memorandum and Articles of Association, every member shall, in the event of the Association being wound up, contribute to the assets of the Association to the extent of HK\$1. As at 31 August 2011, the Association had 197 registered members.

The Association is principally engaged in the promotion of Islamic principles and the encouragement of the members of the Association to study and practise Islam. The address of its registered office is 8/F., O.R. Sadick Islamic Centre, No. 40 Oi Kwan Road, Wanchai, Hong Kong.

These financial statements are presented in the functional currency, viz. Hong Kong dollars.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION AND ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standard for Private Entities (HKFRS for Private Entities) issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (HKICPA) and the requirements of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. They have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of financial assets which are carried at fair value.

(a) Revenue recognition

Provided that it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the revenue transaction will flow to the Association and the revenue and costs, if any, in respect of the transaction can be measured reliably, revenue is recognised as follows:

- (i) Subscriptions and donations are recognised as revenue when the subscriptions or donations are received.
- (ii) Interest income is recognised on a time proportion basis taking into account the principal outstanding and the interest rate applicable.

(b) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Subsequent expenditure is charged to the asset's carrying amount only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance costs are expensed in the income statement during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Depreciation of property, plant and equipment is calculated using the straight line method to allocate cost to their residual values over their estimated useful lives. The annual rate of depreciation for furniture, fixtures and equipment is 20%.

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - continued

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION AND ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

(c) Investments in available-for-sale financial assets

Available-for-sale financial assets are included in non-current assets unless management intends to dispose of the investment within 12 months of the balance sheet date. They are carried at fair value with changes in fair value recognised in the income statement. When securities classified as available-for-sale are sold or impaired, the accumulated fair value adjustments are included in the income statement as gain or losses from investment securities.

(d) Designated funds

All income accruing to and all expenses attributable to a designated fund are accounted for directly in each particular fund.

The General Council have the discretion to use or transfer any funds in the furtherance of the objects of the Association except in instances where funds and donations when received for a specific purpose shall not be utilized for any other purpose without the prior approval of the donors.

(e) Foreign currency translation

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the exchange rate prevailing at the dates of the transactions. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translation at year-end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognised in the income statement.

(f) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.
